Fishing-Golf

Fishing-Golf is very similar to the common sport Golf but instead of a golf club this game is played with a fishing rod. You can play this on a golf course or on any similar place outside.

Building up the course

1. Golf course :

An approx. 30 x 30 cm coloured cloth with a round cut-out of 12cm Ø in the centre, has to be placed over a golf hole. The cloth is fixed with nails on the grass.

2. any other place outside:

You can use differently coloured cloths or commercial wash bowls of equal size (see 1.)

The quantity and positions and also the starting point and the finish may be chosen freely.

The courses, meaning the distance from a cloth/bowl to the next one, has to be defined prior starting the match

Rules of the game

For each cast, done from the start to finish cloth/bowl, the player scores a point.

If you play on a golf course and the ball is putted in one cast without passing the cloth, the player only scores 0,5 points.

Hazards

If the "Fishing-Golf-Ball" gets caught in a tree or falls into a water hazard the player receives a penalty point.

Trees and bushes

The following cast has to be done from a place as close to the hazard as possible.

The player may choose the place in a radius according to the length of the fishing rod.

If only the fishing rod gets entangled in a bush or tree but the ball landed on the ground, the fishing line can be untangled and the player may continue from the place where the ball landed.

In this case the player will not receive penalty points.

Water hazards

The ball can be taken out of the water and the player can continue from a place as close to the water as possible. And again the place may be chosen in a radius according to the length of the fishing rod.

The player with the lowest score after completion of all courses is declared the **winner**. In case of a tie, a play-off is to be contested on the shortest course and repeated until the winner is declared.
